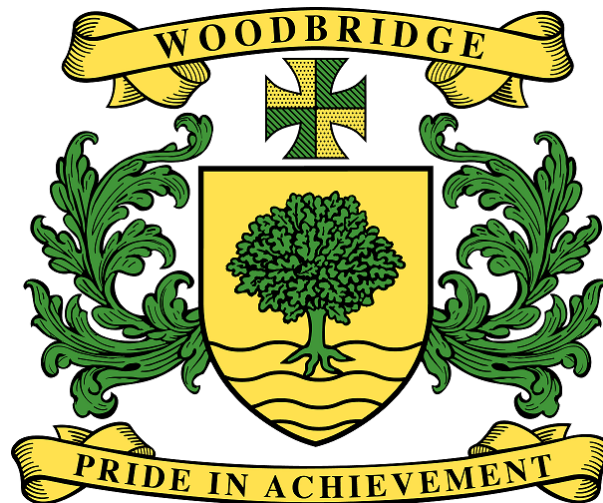

Modal shift away from the car must be achieved within the last three years for the **Silver level**.
