





VTQ Courses	VTQ Courses 2 years Choose a combination of VTQ courses. Assessed by coursework and exams. Equivalent to three A Levels.		45 points
Three A Levels	2 years	Mostly assessed by exams in Y13. Consider studying an Extended Project or Maths Studies alongside.	50 points
Combination of A Levels and VTQs	2 years	A wide range of subjects to choose from. Equivalent to three A levels.	50 points
Four A Levels	2 years	Speak to the 6 th form team if interested.




