Student – Notes

- Use Unifrog to search for courses
- Use the UCAS search tool to research courses
- Visit UCAS online – YouTube
- www.qaa.ac.uk reports on the quality and standards of UK HE
- Look at the 'Good University guide' on the Times website
- Remember **always** to 'log off' from UCAS when you have finished as hackers can corrupt your data!
- Please use any 'free' time to research courses and Universities thoroughly paying particular attention to ENTRY REQUIREMENTS. To ensure you meet the entry requirements for a particular course You will need to know your predicted grades (please go and see your subject teacher).
- Be aware that some courses expect you to have or to have organised, subject specific work experience / placements therefore if you haven't already done so organise it now!
- look at Open Day dates immediately and arrange to visit at least 2 or 3 Universities with family and friends.
- Book onto some 'taster' days at Unis – see Miss Iyengar / Miss Khudeza
- For blogs and web chats use ucasconnect.com / twitter / face book / YouTube / Instagram
- Make use of the 'drop-in' sessions in PSR1 with Mrs Copley which are on offer
- **When you 'pay and send' your application IT DOES NOT GO TO UCAS it is sent to Mrs Copley.** The sooner you complete your application and personal statement the sooner Mrs Copley can check it for any errors. She will also meet with you to discuss your application and to return the form to you if there are mistakes.
- Mrs Copley will enter your predicted grades and attach your reference to your application before she approves it and sends it to UCAS.
- When Mrs Copley has sent your application to UCAS you will receive a welcome letter from UCAS. Using your login details and personal ID number, You will be able to log on to 'Track' to receive decisions / offers / invitations
- If the course you have chosen requires you to have an interview / audition / essay / test, then you will receive an invitation via 'Track'. You **must** reply via 'Track'. You will have the opportunity to accept, decline or request an alternative date and time.
