## GCSE Psychology OCR 1-9

Welcome to GCSE Psychology,

At Woodbridge we are very happy to offer our students the chance to study GCSE Psychology; this is a dynamic and exciting course which encourages critical thinking and discussion.

## What is Psychology?

Psychology is the scientific study of the human mind and behaviour.

## Course over view

The course structure follows a clear and straightforward structure. It contains exciting subject content helping students explain everyday social phenomena; for example,' why we obey', 'why we conform to others'. Certain topics in the course structure also allow us to study real world historical events such as 'the holocaust' and how from psychological perspective such events can be explained. There is a balance of classic and modern psychological theory and research, emphasis on 'doing psychology' and a clear focus on mental health conditions.

#### **Structure**

The course is a two year linear course which is 100% examination based. Students will learn a variety of content across both years 10 and 11 and will then be examined after the two years in the way of two written examination papers.

In each unit, students study two core studies; through with they develop knowledge and understanding of the five core areas of psychology:

Students will also need to have a significant grasp of mathematical skill especially for the research methods unit.
