

The PE department heard the excellent news that Aria Lord has competed in the British Open Karate championships and came 2nd in her category!



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School of Rock - Musical Production




Congratulations to our students who took part in the Drama Matters

Off the back of our winter student voice survey, students commented that they had no incentive or rewards for going to clubs.


