Woodbridge High School Celebrates Best Ever GCSE Results

Woodbridge High School is celebrating some excellent GCSE and Cambridge National results for students in year 11 today. Students were at the school in Woodford Green this morning to collect their results envelopes and to enrol for the school's Sixth Form.

A large number of students achieved outstanding outcomes in their exams, including some of the highest achievers who achieved straight grades 8 and 9. The school saw 29pc of all GCSEs graded at 7 or better. As well as this, 80pc of all students achieved grade 4 or better in both English and Maths. These are the best ever results for the school.

Rachana Mukhund achieved seven 9's and three 8's and will be taking up a place in the Sixth Form at Woodbridge in September. Rachana said "I'm really excited to have these great results and so grateful to all the teachers. I'm really happy that all the hard work has paid off."

Eyaan Wali will be studying A Levels at Woodbridge in September. He was delighted with his results, achieving six 9's, two 8's and one 7. He said, "I did better than I thought! Woodbridge is a great school with great support. Keep going even if you are feeling down, it will all work out".

Anna Harley, who achieved six 9's and three 8's said "I'm so happy and can't wait to start studying English Literature, History and RE at Woodbridge."

The majority of Woodbridge students will be continuing at the school as they join its outstanding Sixth Form in September, with enrolment taking place today and tomorrow. Woodbridge offers one of the widest ranges of A Level and vocational courses available locally. The school says that there may be some places left for students from other schools for some courses, and staff will be on hand at the school to advise.

Steven Hogan, Headteacher at Woodbridge High School, said: "Our year 11 students have made all of us so proud today. We talk a lot at Woodbridge about 'aiming for excellence' and that is exactly what our students have done once again this year.

I am particularly pleased about the fact that we have again seen our results increase on the previous year, as the school continues to go from strength to strength. These GCSE students faced Covid lockdowns in years 7 and 8, and despite this have gone on to great things.

The overall figures are fantastic, of course, but today we particularly celebrate every one of our students as an individual. GCSE exam grades act like a passport to the next stage in their lives for them, and I am so pleased that so many now have the opportunities that they deserve.

The students of Team Woodbridge are awesome, and I loved seeing their excited faces as they collected their results this morning. It's one of the best days of the year for me, and I congratulate each and every one of our students. They are superstars."
