Dear Parent / Carer,

As part of the Year 10 Life Studies programme during this academic year, your child will have lessons in sex education, in accordance with statutory guidance and in line with the school's Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) policy and syllabus.

Sex education is an important part of the RSHE curriculum and it is important young people are given accurate, reliable and appropriate information about relationships, sex and health. They should be equipped with the skills to make appropriate use of the range of information available to them in the wider world and on the internet, and shown how to use this to make appropriate informed choices about sex and relationships. This should happen in a supportive environment, and both at home and in school are the best places for this education to occur.

Whilst the school and specialist teachers are well placed to provide relationships, sex and health education, we acknowledge that parents are the main teachers of any young person and it is a shared responsibility between schools, parents / carers and the community. Whilst I hope that you would recognise that the provision of this programme within school provides an opportunity for us all to work together to promote positive behaviours and attitudes to sex and relationships, I am required to advise you that you do have the right to withdraw your child from the sex education lessons within the Life Studies syllabus, should you wish to do so. Please note that within the statutory guidance there is no right to withdraw from relationships or health education lessons.

Within the programme for Year 10 Life Studies in 2025–26 the following lessons are designated as sex education:

- Term 1 Lesson 1: Positive relationship values and expectations
- Term 1 Lesson 2: Sexual relationships (consent, peer pressure, sexual safety & the impact of drugs and alcohol)
- Term 1 Lesson 3: Sexual health clinics and how to access help
- Term 1 Lesson 4: Teen pregnancy and young parenthood (including fostering, adoption & abortion)

In the event that any timetabled lessons are lost due to bank holidays or other school closures then some of these lessons may need to be merged.

I must inform you that as part of the statutory guidance, when a student reaches three terms before their 16th birthday, if they have been withdrawn from Sex Education by their parents, they are entitled to request that they can return to lessons. In line with the school RSHE policy, any withdrawn student will be informed of this right when they reach the correct point within the school year.

If you choose to withdraw your child, you will recognise the need to provide appropriate information about these topics at home. Alternative supervision arrangements will be made for any student withdrawn from these lessons and they will be given alternative Life Studies work from a different topic to complete. **Please note that, even if you have withdrawn your child from sex education in the previous academic year, an updated request is required for each year.**
